Tackling crime in the NDC Area – Neighbourhood Policing

A revolutionary type of policing has been launched in the NDC area to bring communities, police and partners closer together.

Neighbourhood Policing aims to make communities feel safe and secure by reducing crime and anti-social behaviour.

Dedicated Neighbourhood Policing Teams (NPTs) have been set up in every ward in Hartlepool to respond to resident priorities and issues. Police Officers working in the NDC area are based at the NDC Community Safety Office at 173 York Road alongside other members of the NDC Neighbourhood Management Team.

Sergeant Cath Campbell, one of the Neighbourhood Policing Sergeants covering the NDC area, added: "We are looking forward to further developing our relationships with local residents through Neighbourhood Policing. The team is on hand to work with residents to resolve any issues or to provide them with advice."

Not only can NDC residents benefit from the new form of policing but they have the advantage of other crime, community safety and environmental initiatives that are ongoing in the area.

Clare Clark, NDC Community Safety Manager, added: "With the help of Partners such as Hartlepool Borough

Council, and the Police, NDC have made real progress in the area over recent years in reducing crime and improving safety. This progress will be continued with support from Neighbourhood Policing."
